Q: What is the purpose of the George Roberts Community Grant Program?

Its purpose is to assist groups in NunatuKavut communities in celebrating culture while improving economic, social, physical, mental and spiritual well-being.

Q: When is the deadline for applications?

There are four deadlines per year:

- January 15
- April 15
- June 15
- September 15

Please apply as early as possible; the grant review process will take up to four weeks following the deadline. Only one application per applicant is permitted for each intake period.

Q: Who is eligible?

Any non-profit or community organization seeking financial assistance for programs, events, festivals or any other initiatives that will promote the well-being and culture of NunatuKavut Inuit.

Q: What amount of funding will be available?

Grants will be available up to a maximum of \$4,000. Any monies not used for the activity/initiative applied for must be returned to NunatuKavut Community Council.

Q: Do grant recipients have to complete a final report to NunatuKavut Community Council?

Yes. All recipients must complete the final report attached with this application and submitted within four weeks after the completion of the activity/initiative. Please include participant feedback and pictures of the event if possible.
